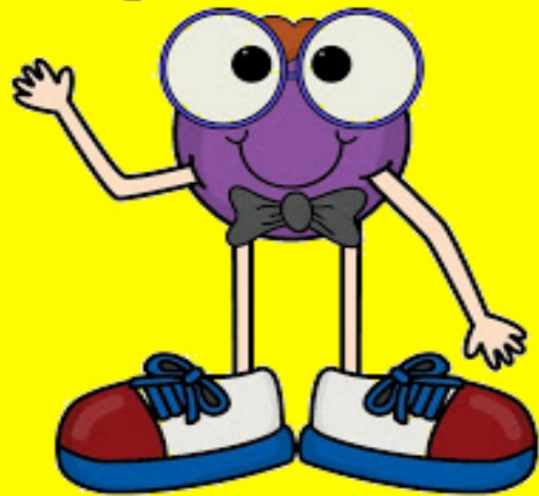

Imperative Sentences

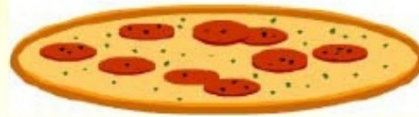
An *imperative* sentence gives a command or makes a request.

Open your mouth.

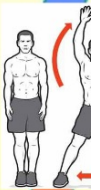


Please bring the pizza to the table.

Per la costruzione dell'imperativo inglese si segue il seguente schema:

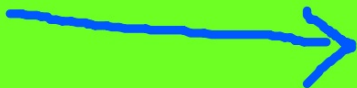
Forma affermativa:

FORMA BASE (infinito senza to)

Listen! (ascolta/ascoltate!)

Be quiet! (stai zitto/state zitti!)

Jump!



Forma negativa:

DON'T + FORMA BASE

Don't talk (non parlare/non parlate!)

Don't be silly! (non essere sciocco/non siate sciocchi!)

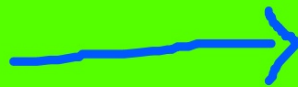

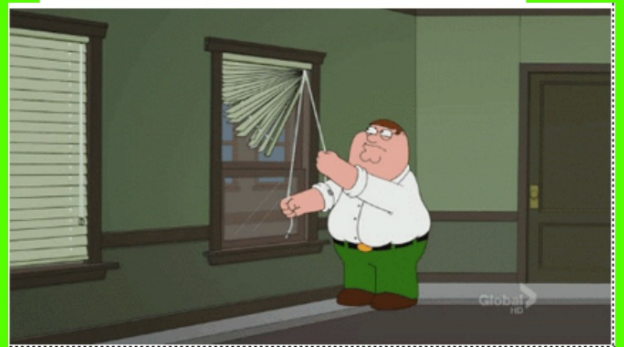

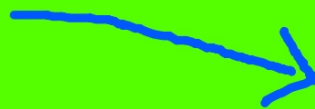
