


Where is Ireland?



THE GUINNESS IS A DARK BEER SYMBOL OF IRELAND, PRODUCED IN DUBLIN SINCE 1759. IT IS DARK AND BITTER WITH WHITE FOAM ON THE TOP.

Other legends are the leprechauns, in the gaelic language this means "little ghosts"; these were the inhabitants of Ireland well before the Celts. People believe they have got a pot of gold hidden in the Irish countryside. They are sometimes drawed like shoemakers.
